## Cross-Country Golf Gets Literal

After several years on alternate holes within the Beaver Creek Athletic Club, Cross-Country Golf returned to its original par-62 hole on Day One of Winter Camp @ Camp. The adults and the youth faced off against each other.

Observers have conjectured that the youth team took longer to finish than any previous golf team, as their trek from tee to green was clocked at 2 hours and 40 minutes. Their score of 56, 16 strokes ahead of the adults, suggests that their time and energy was perhaps well-spent. The adults reported losing only one golf ball, due to an errant Dave Oakley shot.

Experienced XC golfers know of the challenge in getting the ball into the hole at the back of the bottom of the Face, but John Ferencz set a new record for shooting when his 6-inch putt, executed with a wood club, overshot the 6-foot square hole entirely.

At home on Day Four, Gabe Church put the literal "country" in Cross-Country Golf when he laid out a half-mile course in Colorado at Lory State Park (right). In a successful effort to avoid Dave Oakley's fate, he played his round with a tennis ball, as was done at Winter Camp XXXIII (where Gabe was the youth leader). Gabe notes that though his route appears to cross over water, that part of his trek passes over a dry lake bed where water used to be. Gabe shot a 64.

For Michigan homecampers, a course was laid out at Heritage Park in Taylor. Dave Oakley set out on a quest for redemption



along with Jay and Gavin Botorff, but lost 3 balls along the path.


