The **Frugal Roman** Meal is the first thematic meal of Winter Camp XXXI and will, we are certain, launch the event well. This meal theme is new this year; the menu is drawn from the Oakes Lunch, which premiered at Winter Camp II.

For the **Emperor's Dinner**, various teams will be tasked to cook different dishes with the goal of pleasing the Emperor. This meal is making its Winter Camp debut as well, but traces its origins to the Ark Dinner of Winter Camp XXVI and XXVII, which itself finds its roots in the *Iron Chef* TV series.

The **Bakery Snack** was first served at Winter Camp XXII, but freshly-baked bread has been a Winter Camp tradition since Winter Camp I. Your chance to contribute to this tradition will occur tonight in and around the Blind Hikes.

Tomorrow will launch with the new **Southern Breakfast**. Southwestern scrambled eggs, along with biscuits and gravy, will surely fuel us well for the day of service to follow.

Lunch tomorrow will be the first-ever **Meal On Wheels**. So as not to interrupt the day of service that dates back to Winter Camp III, lunch will be delivered to the work sites.

## Winter Camp Participation Award—Don't Miss Out!

The Winter Camp Participation Award is the most prestigious award that can be earned by a youth member of Migisi Opawgan lodge. Now is the time for you to earn this gold-bordered Winter Camp patch! Here are the requirements:

# 1. While attending Winter Camp, do each of the following:

- a. Participate in baking a loaf of bread or similar baked good.
- b. Help set up or coordinate an event.
- c. Provide four (4) hours of service to camp.
- d. Climb D-A's highest peak.
- e. Participate in the Blind Hike.
- f. Set a personal goal to achieve during camp and achieve it. (**Note**: Due to the logical paradox involved, "Earn the

Winter Camp Participation Award" is not an acceptable personal goal.)

# 2. While attending Winter Camp, do at least two of the following:

- a. Participate in a project aimed at improving Winter Camp.
- b. Write an article or short story for the Winter Camp *News*.
- c. Sleep outdoors safely during Winter Camp.
- d. Hold a leadership position. This includes serving as youth leader or any other office designated by the leader.

#### 3. Do at least two of the following:

- a. Pass the Winter Camp Basic History Test (available from Mark Bollman).
- b. Surf the Winter Camp Universe and participate in one or more discussion ar-

eas

c. Define the following terms: CHR, Jiffy, Kitchamajig, El Mediodia, Quiet Hours, Rand Stew, Weekette, Winter Camp Savings Time.

In earning the Winter Camp Participation Award, you will join an elite crew of 21 Arrowmen who have earned this award in previous years. Your gold-bordered patch will be presented to you at a ceremony that ensures that the patch will not be touched by the hands of an adult Arrowman. No adult worthy of the name would touch a Participation Award, unless it is the one that he earned as a youth. Perhaps someday there will be a square knot available for those adults.

# Back In The Day

In 1991, Winter Camp confronted a dilemma head-on: Since it's held in North America in late December, daylight was in short supply for the annual event. That astronomical reality, combine with a prevailing tendency for campers to keep late hours and sleep late, led to a call for action.

Since the first choice, slowing down the Earth's rotation, wasn't practical, the daylight that *is* present was redistributed by resetting the clocks—and Winter Camp Savings Time was born. In the intervening years, every Winter Camp has run on Winter Camp Savings Time (WCST), which is 77 minutes ahead of Eastern Standard Time. As a result, when we're eating breakfast tomorrow morning at 9:00, it'll be 7:43 back in Metro Detroit, which allows us to make better use of the daylight we have.

Check your watch now.

But don't worry, you'll get all that time back when you leave camp.
