Back In The Day

The idea of a theme for Winter Camp had been kicked around occasionally, but was only first put in place at Winter Camp XV in 1991. Several new events combined with reworked classics for a Medieval event, and many of those same trappings were slightly time-shifted for the Renaissance theme at Winter Camp XVI.

Winter Camp XVII boldly went where no Winter Camp had gone previously by adopting a *Star Trek: The Next Generation* theme. In the next two years, thematic integration reached its peak with Pirates taking center stage at Winter Camp XVIII and Vikings the theme of Winter Camp XIX. The Viking camp kicked off with the Mead Marathon, which featured two— or three-man teams competing to drink 88 ounces of cold well water and run to the BC Skills building to retrieve replacement water. The aftereffects of this event were commemorated in verse:

Nineteen conquered new worlds of fun In the Viking Olympics: Day One. Like the tail of a comet The snow streaked with vomit Bore witness to what we had done.

Winter Camp XX adopted an Indian theme, but the thematic events were overshadowed by the 20th anniversary banquet and other milestone events. Themes returned in force at Winter Camp XXI, which adopted an Area 51 theme and included the Area 51 Role-Playing Game, which assigned specific roles to campers, all connected in one way or another to the question of alien visitation.
