# Back In The Day

Tonight's dinner will be Bollmano's Pizza. Pizza has been served at every Winter Camp, but it hasn't always been a dinner or called Bollmano's.

At Winter Camp I, the pizza meal didn't have a theme (none of the meals sat Winter Camp I had themes—they started at Winter Camp II). It was a good meal, but was widely remembered for the excessive amount of pepperoni used for the pizzas. As with the Bollmano's version, each camper got his own pizza, but at Winter Camp I they had a pound of pepperoni each.

Beginning at Winter Camp VII, pizza was called "Little Ozzie's Pizza". It was led by head chef Mike Osvath, who sometimes spent a whole afternoon creating the list of ingredients based on leftovers.

Following Mike's wedding in 1991, the camp pizzeria was known as "Little Charlie's" in commemoration of an error by the priest at his nuptials.

By Winter Camp XV, Mark Bollman—> had joined Little Ozzie's as the head cook and Mike's role was largely ceremonial. He prepared the topping list and reminded us of the slogan "Good Food, — Good Pizza", but that was about it.

When Mike failed to attend Winter Camp XVII, Mark—> made his move and began calling it Bollmano's pizza (there is some question of pronunciation — apparently Mark had hoped for BOLL-man-o's, but campers preferred boll-MAN-o's and the die was cast.

Little Ozzie returned to subsequent Winter Camps and attempted to assert dominance over the Italian favorite, but he was never again able to wrest control from Bollman. This battle was the subject of Steve Donohue's failed claymation movie.

Today Bollmano's, with its slogan, "The finest Italian cuisine in the wilderness" remains the dominant pizza purveyor.
