message from Channel 120 in Lapeer, the only broadcast operation still on the air after the three-way takeover of the world. Channel 120 is also known as WCXX-TV, and traces its origin to Mark Bollman—>'s Winter Camp novel of the same name, which he wrote in 1993 as his assignment in the first-ever Hobby Draw, and which premiered at Winter Camp XVII (now in the first half of Winter Camp history). Channel 120 tells the story of Winter Camp and America under the thumb of the Moral Reform Act, a draconian law enacted in 1994 which crushes the BSA. though not Winter Camp. The MRA was first mentioned in "The Last Ceremony", a rededication ceremony originally written by Jeff Rand.

Channel 120 was the first Winter Camp novel, and was followed in short order by Steve Donohue's Paradox Metaphor and Jeff Rand's Another Ten Seconds. Mark—> and Steve have been collaborating for 12 years on After The Apocalypse, a tale of Winter Camp's post-nuclear exploits, heroic and otherwise. Jeff is said to be at work on Zero Node, which explores further some of the themes in ATS.

The three completed novels may be found in the Winter Camp library, and the two works in progress are serialized on the Winter Camp Web site.
