Back In The Day

The Winter Camp Future Society was founded at Winter Camp XI in 1987 in an effort to provide for the continuation of Winter Camp and its traditions throughout the coming years. Members have collectively paid into accounts which, when invested, have been used to enhance every fifth Winter Camp beginning with Winter Camp XX in 1996.

In 1996, the Society's funds sponsored an anniversary dinner at Wyckoff Lodge and provided dark blue T-shirts for all campers. For 2001, at Winter Camp XXV, the WCFS funded, in part, the 162-Dish Banquet.

The WCFS funds for Winter Camp XXX were used to produce camp neckerchiefs for everyone at camp. Rather than a large dinner, a smaller party was held in the evening.

Members of the WCFS are currently discussing ways in which their money, invested just after Winter Camp XXX, may be used to enhance Winter Camp XXXV, Scouting, and the Winter Camp grounds in general.

Any Arrowmen who has attended three Winter Camps and makes the necessary financial commitment may join the Society, which is now accepting members for the class of Winter Camp XL, to be held in 2016. The cost of membership in the class of XL is the cost of Winter Camp XX, \$30.30 for youth and \$36.36 for adults. Membership dues must be paid by the close of Winter Camp XXXV.
